

Massive fires spurred by 80 mile per hour winds overnight and into the morning are burning in Napa and Sonoma Counties, which have been the scene of utter devastation today.

Due to the haze and quickly-spreading haze, nobody knows how many homes have burned, but it's likely they number in the hundreds.

Landmarks, including Fountaingrove Inn, Hilton Sonoma Wine Country hotel, and a Kmart store, burned to the ground, while all major hospitals, including Kaiser and Sutter Health, were being quickly evacuated, often with staff piling patients into their own cars and fleeing with them to other medical units south of the fire zone.

Scores of homes were lost as one of the four blazes that are burning, the Tubbs Fire, roared through mobile home parks.

Smoke filled much of the Bay Area skies and has been drifting as far south as Alameda County and Pacifica.

All schools in the affected counties were closed and power outages are widespread.

A number of Napa Valley wineries were reportedly destroyed.

Mandatory mass evacuations are underway throughout the area, including the entire city of Santa Rosa, Napa, Guerneville, Fulton, and Rohnert Park, plus dozens of other communities.
