### May 16, 2017

#### Daytime Residential Burglaries

Pacifica, CA – On May 15, 2017 the Pacifica Police Department responded to five residential burglaries in the city which had occurred between 7:00 AM and 4:00 PM that day.

At approximately 12:55 PM, officers responded to the 200 block of Stanley Avenue after a witness reported seeing two subjects running from a residential backyard carrying property. Officers discovered the rear glass door had been smashed and later confirmed with residents that property had been taken.

The two subjects seen were described as African American males in their twenties with medium builds wearing black hooded sweatshirts.

At approximately 1:15 PM, officers responded to the 1000 block of View Way on a report of a residential burglary. The resident reported they had left approximately two hours earlier and returned home to find at least one room had been ransacked and items including electronics and jewelry had been taken. A vehicle was captured on surveillance in the area and believed to be involved in this burglary. It is described as a dark blue/gray compact sport utility vehicle similar to a newer model Toyota RAV-4 or a Nissan Rogue.

Residential burglaries were also reported at a second residence on the 1000 block of View Way, the 700 block on Montezuma Drive, and on the 1000 block of Manzanita Drive.

Entry in each of these cases was made through a rear window or door. Burglars targeted jewelry, laptops, tablets and personal electronics.

Residents are encouraged to be alert for unfamiliar subjects and vehicles in their neighborhoods, and to immediately report the same by calling the Pacifica Police Department at 650-738-7314. *If you see something, say something.*

Detectives are following up on leads in these cases and working with neighboring law enforcement agencies. Anyone with information about these burglaries is encouraged to contact detectives at the Pacifica Police Department by calling 650-738-7314. Information can also be provided anonymously by calling the Silent Witness Tip Line at 650-359-4444.
