The Pacific Institute recently released an excellent (and brief) report — <u>An Assessment of Urban Water Demand Forecasts in California</u> — that found "For all of the water suppliers examined, the demand forecasts dramatically overestimated future water demand." It reinforces one of TRT's main contentions — that the SFPUC's opposition to releasing more water into the Tuolumne is based largely on inflated future water demand projections.
