Earth Day is quickly approaching, and we need your support on two actions.

Our [Earth Day Rally for the River](#) will take place on the steps of SF City Hall on Tuesday, April 23 from noon-1pm. Please plan to attend and bring friends. The general theme is that SFPUC policies don't just harm the environment, but they hurt people and communities as well. Speakers will cover toxic algae blooms in the Delta and Bay, possible curtailment or closure of the salmon fishing season (again), tribal issues and impacts of misguided SFPUC policies on ratepayers. Following the rally, a number of us will attend the regular SFPUC meeting at 1:30.

In parallel, we're targeting Governor Newsom, who's support for Voluntary Agreements to replace the Bay Delta Plan has caused years of delay on relief for the beleaguered Bay-Delta and rivers that feed it. We ask you to send a card to Newsom to demonstrate that people (voters) are paying attention to his actions, and we demand that he drop his defense of Big Ag and instead support what the Bay-Delta really needs — more freshwater inflow. Newsom might ignore emails, but he'll notice a stack of cards on his desk.
