The wild Prohibition days of rumrunners, moonshiners and speakeasies in the area that is today's Pacifica will be the topic. It was a time when the area was infamous, considered the "wettest" county in the state. Rumrunners landed Canadian whiskey on isolated beaches, moonshiners operated in homes and speakeasies drew clients from San Francisco and beyond.
